Board Examination Results – 2025 (A Proud Milestone)

The Board Examination Results 2025 stand out as one of the most significant and defining achievements of the academic year, reflecting the unwavering commitment of Rajagiri Amala CMI Public School to academic excellence.

A total of 39 students appeared for the examination and all 39 students passed, securing a remarkable 100% pass result. Of these, three students (7.7%) emerged as all A1 holders, while an impressive 16 students (41%) scored 90% and above. It is indeed noteworthy that 35 students (89.7%) secured Distinction, while the remaining four students (10.3%) achieved First Class, clearly underscoring the consistently high academic standards and excellence upheld by the school.

The top scorers of the year were Tensa Philomin Xavier (486/500), Meera S. Nair (485/500), Jeffin Joy (472/500) and Issac Neijin Babu (483/500), whose outstanding performance brought immense pride to the institution. In recognition of this exceptional achievement, the three All A1 scorers were honoured by Kochi Metro Sahodaya at a grand programme hosted at Rajagiri Public School, graced by Shri. Hibi Eden,

Hon'ble Member of Parliament, adding further distinction to this academic triumph.

This resounding success is the outcome of the visionary leadership and firm academic foundation

laid by the former Principal, Rev. Fr. Sijo Menachery CMI, whose foresight and guidance continue to inspire the institution. Equally commendable are the tireless efforts, dedication and mentoring of our committed teachers, who walked alongside the students with patience, perseverance and purpose, transforming potential into performance.

The Board Examination Results 2025 thus stand as a shining testimony to the collective endeavour of students, parents, teachers and management and



reaffirm the school's mission to nurture excellence, discipline, and holistic growth in every learner.

Academic Activities of the Year 2025–26

Reopening of the School and Commencement of the Academic Year

The school reopened on Wednesday, 4th June 2025, with a grand and culturally rich opening ceremony. The students were accorded a traditional welcome with the vibrant rhythms of Panchari Melam. As a symbol of sweetness and goodwill, teachers distributed kalkandam and applied kalabham on the foreheads of the students, signifying purity, warmth and auspicious beginnings.



The formal ceremony was graced by Rev. Fr. Sebin Periapadan CMI, who extended a cordial welcome to the school community. On this occasion, the newly joined Principal, Mr. Juby Paul was formally introduced to the students. The entire campus was tastefully decorated, creating an atmosphere of joy and renewal. Parents and PTA members were also present, marking the spirit of shared partnership. In a symbolic gesture, the Principal handed over lit candles to the teachers, signifying the passing on of knowledge and enlightenment, as teachers and students together ushered in the new academic year.

Expansion to Senior Secondary Level

The grand reopening of the Kindergarten and the inauguration of Grade XI were held on 14th June 2025. The occasion was blessed by Rev. Fr. Benny Nalkara CMI, Provincial, Sacred Heart Province. The formal inauguration was carried out by Smt. C. K. Asha, MLA, Vaikom, in the esteemed presence of Smt. Sreeju Shaji, President, TV Puram Grama Panchayath.



With the introduction of a new Plus One batch, the school proudly attained the status of a Senior Secondary School, equipped with one of the finest infrastructures in Vaikom, marking a significant milestone in its academic journey.

Assessment Planning and Academic Calendar

On 18th June 2025, the school published a comprehensive assessment structure for the academic year 2025–26. The document detailed assessment dates, portions, rubrics and evaluation criteria, ensuring transparency and clarity for students and parents alike.

Based on this structured plan, assessments were conducted regularly in the form of monthly tests, class tests, periodic assessments and term-end examinations. The First Term concluded in October 2025, while the Second Term will conclude in March 2026.

Open Houses and Parent Interaction

To keep parents closely informed about their children's academic progress, Open House sessions were conducted after examinations. These were held on 28th June 2025, 23rd August 2025 and 15th November 2025, providing opportunities for meaningful dialogue between parents and teachers and reinforcing the home–school partnership.



Academic Support and Exam Preparedness

For Class X, the prescribed syllabus was completed by 30th October 2025, and intensive revision commenced from 1st November 2025. Evening coaching classes were introduced from July onwards, offering additional academic support. Remedial sessions were conducted continuously for slow learners, with focused attention on strengthening fundamentals and enhancing performance in the forthcoming Board Examinations.

SAFAL Assessments

In accordance with CBSE regulations, SAFAL examinations were conducted for Grade IX on 10th, 12th, and 17th November 2025 and for Grade VI

on 24th and 26th November 2025, and 1st December 2025. These assessments helped gauge students' conceptual understanding and provided valuable diagnostic insights to further improve teaching-learning strategies.

Overall, the academic year 2025–26 was marked by structured planning, meaningful expansion, continuous assessment and strong academic support systems, reflecting the school's unwavering commitment to quality education and student success.

Faculty Enrichment and Professional Development

In pursuit of academic excellence and continuous professional growth, the academic year 2025–26 was marked by the enthusiastic participation of our teachers in a wide range of capacity-building and professional development programmes organised by CBSE, Sahodaya clusters, reputed publishers and premier educational institutions. The Principal, Mr. Juby Paul, also remained actively engaged in professional advancement. He attended the Progressive Resource Person Training on *School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework* at Chinmaya Vidyalaya, Thrissur, on 19th and 20th September 2025, and completed the Training of Trainers Course in collaboration with CBSE and ISTM New Delhi at Dr. Raju Davis International School, Mala, on 11th and 12th July 2025. Further extending his academic leadership beyond the institution, he served as a Resource Person for teachers of Thrissur Central Sahodaya on *Critical and Creative Thinking* (21st May 2025), at Mary Matha Public School, Pala on *Happy Classrooms* (6th December 2025), and for students and parents of *Dr. Zakir Hussain Memorial Bharatiya Vihara, Changanassery* and *Ahalya Public School, Palakkad*.

An exclusive in-house training programme was also organised for all teachers of Rajagiri Amala CMI Public School on 23rd May 2025 on the theme “Emotion and Teaching: The Power of Emotional Intelligence in the Classroom.” The session was led by Mrs. Gayathri Padmanabhan, TEDx Speaker, who eloquently highlighted the pivotal role of emotional intelligence in effective teaching-learning processes, classroom management, and student well-being. The programme enriched teachers with deeper insights into empathy-driven

pedagogy, self-awareness, and emotionally responsive classrooms, thereby strengthening the human connect at the heart of education.



These sustained efforts in professional learning underscore the school's steadfast commitment to nurturing empowered educators, inspired leadership, and progressive classroom practices, thereby enriching the overall quality of teaching and learning.

Parent Orientation and Community Awareness Initiatives

Recognising parents as valued partners in the educational journey of every child, the school organised a series of structured orientation and awareness programmes during the academic year 2025–26, aimed at fostering meaningful home–school collaboration and shared responsibility in student development.

Orientation programmes were thoughtfully planned and conducted for different grade levels to address age-specific academic expectations, behavioural guidance and holistic growth. Parents of Classes I & II were oriented on 2nd June 2025, followed by a dedicated Kindergarten Parents' Orientation on 3rd June 2025, which focused on easing young learners into formal schooling with confidence and care. An orientation for parents of Classes III, IV and V was held on 28th June 2025, alongside a comprehensive session for parents of Classes VI, VII and VIII on the same day, emphasising academic progression, adolescent well-being and effective parental support at home.

In addition to academic orientations, the school also organised an awareness programme for parents on "Say No to Rabies" on 19th July 2025. The session was led by Dr. Vineetha Simon, Medical Officer, PHC, TV Puram, who sensitised parents on prevention, early symptoms and timely medical intervention, underscoring the importance of community health and safety.



Student Orientation and Awareness Programmes

As part of the school's holistic approach to education, the academic year 2025–26 featured a series of well-structured orientation and awareness programmes for students, aimed at nurturing responsible citizenship, personal safety, mental agility and informed decision-making.

A Legal Awareness Programme was conducted on 21st August 2025, led by Sri. Kannan Das, Sub Inspector of Police, Special Branch, who sensitised students to the basics of law, civic responsibility and the consequences of unlawful behaviour, thereby fostering respect for legal systems and ethical conduct.

In response to the growing digital footprint of adolescents, a Cyber Security Awareness Session was organised on 17th September 2025 for high school students. The session was handled by Sri. Viju E. P. and Sri. Rahul K., Civil Police Officers from the Cyber Crime Police Station, Kottayam, focusing on safe online practices, cyber threats, digital footprints and responsible use of technology.

To further empower students with essential life skills, an inspiring session titled "Train Your Brain" was conducted on 13th October 2025 by Mr. Nandalala. The programme motivated young minds to think sharper, aim higher and achieve greater, equipping them with practical strategies for focus, resilience and goal-oriented learning.

Through these student-centric initiatives, along with orientation programmes for parents, teachers and school leadership, the school has ensured that orientation and training sessions were provided for all stakeholders, reinforcing a shared vision of informed, safe, confident and future-ready learners.

Co-Curricular and Enrichment Activities at School

Kindergarten Learning Experiences

The Kindergarten section was enriched with a variety of hands-on and experiential learning activities designed to nurture curiosity, independence, and joyful learning. A Puppet Story Session conducted on 18th July 2025 featured a specially designed puppet booth through which inspiring stories and good habit practices were effectively communicated to the young learners. This was followed by a Sandwich Making Activity on 1st August 2025, where children prepared a healthy breakfast by bringing vegetables and ingredients from home, thereby fostering independence and promoting healthy eating habits.

To introduce and reinforce the concept of primary colours, special colour-themed days were celebrated with great enthusiasm. **Red Colour Day** on 11th July 2025 saw students dressed in red and bringing red-coloured fruits, vegetables, and toys. **Blue Colour Day**, observed on 8th August 2025, featured a beautifully created blue ambience with flowers, toys, and creative displays of the ocean and sky, complete with fishes and birds. **Yellow Colour Day** was celebrated on 19th September 2025, with students and classrooms immersed entirely in yellow through fruits, vegetables, attire, and creative decorations.

At the Kerala State CBSE Kalotsav 2025, Aditya Sandeep secured an A Grade in Hindi Versification, while Sivanandhana K. R. earned an A Grade in Malayalam Essay Writing, reflecting their literary excellence at the State level.

Adding to the laurels of the year, Rajagiri Amala CMI Public School secured the Second Position at the District Level in the Rashtra Bhasha Competition 2025–26, bringing great pride to the institution. The achievement was further enhanced as six of our students emerged as rank holders, Aaradhyaa J of Grade VII secured First Rank, Griffin Varghese Jijo of Grade one secured Second Rank and four students got Third Rank (Siya P. S. – grade IV, Shreya Prakash – Grade VI, Bhavya C Babu – Grade VII and Aditya Sandeep – Grade X), reflecting the school's strong foundation in language excellence.

In the field of quizzing, our Standard III quiz team successfully qualified for the Zonal Level and is set to compete at the District Level PCM Quiz Competition, highlighting the school's consistent encouragement of academic curiosity and intellectual engagement from an early age.

The school won the Third Prize in Cinematic Fusion Dance Competition organised by Naipunya School of Management, Cherthala. In the Angelic Voices Inter-Kindergarten Carol Festival and Obstacle Race organised by Naipunya Public School, Kochi, Advik Ratheesh secured the Third Prize in Obstacle Race.

An impressive 98% of our participants secured A Grades in the events they competed in, and the school achieved an overall 27th position among 68 Sahodaya schools. In group events, the school earned A Grades in Patriotic Song, Group Song, Thiruvathirakali and Group Dance (Category III). Individual accolades included Second Prize in Malayalam Essay Writing (Category III) by Sivanandhana K. R., Third Prize in Malayalam Essay Writing (Category II) by Vaibhav Anand, and Third Prize in English Essay Writing by Abhinandana M. R.

These remarkable accomplishments highlight the school's strong emphasis on nurturing artistic talent, cultural expression and creative confidence, reinforcing its commitment to holistic education beyond the classroom.

Kids Fest 2025 & Splendore 2025

Kids Fest 2025 for Kindergarten and Splendore 2025 for the Senior School served as the School-level Youth Festivals aimed at identifying and nurturing students' talents for participation in various external competitions.



Splendore 2025 for the Senior School was conducted in four categories over a structured schedule from 13th August to 22nd August 2025, providing students with a vibrant platform to exhibit their artistic, literary and performing skills. Kids Fest 2025, catering to the developmental needs of young learners, was spread throughout the academic year, allowing children ample time to practise and participate comfortably.



Both events were conducted successfully, offering every student an opportunity to showcase their talents while enabling the school to identify and prepare the best performers to represent the institution in inter-school and external competitions.

Sports and Games

In keeping with the school's vision of holistic education, equal importance was accorded to sports and games, alongside academics, arts and cultural activities during the academic year 2025–26. All formal ceremonies including flag hoisting, torch lighting and oath-taking were conducted with dignity and precision. Yellow House emerged as the Overall Champion with 353 points, followed by Red House (281 points), Green House (276 points) and Blue House (258 points). The day concluded with the lowering of the flag and handing-over ceremony, led by the House Captains and Sports Captain.

Picnics and Study Tours

Nutritional and Preventive Health Measures
